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Villa no174 in Rio de Janeiro

After working with Emmanuel Ungaro and Giambattista Valli, Srđjan Prodanovic opened his own Villa no174 in March 2014 right in the heart of Santa Teresa, a boho quarter that's nicknamed the little Montmartre of Rio, for its meandering streets that wind up and down stairs and in and out of little colored houses. Part modern art gallery and part tropical seaside villa, the hotel is made up of four studio-suites that are decorated with a mix of inspirations, from jungle prints to Art Deco and 1960s style to the architecture of Jean Prouvé. Boasting views across Sugar Loaf mountain, the hotel celebrates all forms of art from the graffiti-inspired outside walls to the contemporary paintings by the Bosnian artist Radmila Djapic Jovandic inside. This is a unique gem of a hotel in a constant state of flux that's not to be missed.
